UNIVERSITY SENATE MEETING MINUTES

The Chair, Ramesh Raina, opened the meeting, welcoming everyone and acknowledged the Onondaga Nation, the indigenous people on whose ancestral lands Syracuse University now stands. The Chair reminded attendees that if they wish to speak, they should raise their voting clickers to signify that they are a senator, and they should state their name for the record.

The Chair began with the first order of business - the Approval of the minutes from the January 17th Senate meeting. The Chair called for any questions or corrections. As there were none, the Chair made a motion to approve the minutes, the vote was held and the motion carried. The minutes were approved.

The Chair began the next order of business, the Agenda Committee report. The Chair reminded the Senate of the Chancellor's Review that was conducted through the Chancellor's Review Committee in the fall, 2017. The Chair thanked everyone for their participation in the review process. The report was sent to the University's Board of Trustees. After review of the report and the Board's own review, Chairman Steve Barnes has informed the Chair that the Board of Trustees intends to begin the process of renewing the Chancellor's contract, pending continued strong performance and progress on the recommendations that emerged from the review.

The Chair noted that the Senate is exploring providing accessibility accommodations to all during Senate meetings. The Agenda Committee is reviewing providing closed captioning, as well as American Sign Language (ASL) interpreters on the podium during meetings. These accommodations will hopefully start with the March meetings. At the conclusion of his report, the Chair then introduced Chancellor Kent Syverud to give his remarks.

Chancellor's Remarks

The Chancellor made a brief announcement regarding Provost Wheatly who was not in attendance and who will address several important issues at the next Senate meeting in March.

Interest in attending Syracuse growing

- University received a record-setting 34,614 undergraduate applications—a 5.7 percent increase from 2016.
- Undergraduate early decision applications also reached a record level.
 - o Applicants are increasingly impressive and diverse
 - o Thirty-seven percent of the applications come from students of color

Recent Appointments

- o The University has opened an office of University Ombuds, as of Monday, February 19th. The office is headed by Professor Emeritus Samuel Clemence on an interim basis until a permanent Ombuds can be identified by search committee, which should begin this semester.
- O Sheila Johnson-Willis was appointed chief equal opportunity and Title IX officer
- o William Myhill appointed an interim Americans with Disabilities coordinator
 - o Myhill has been the director of legal research and writing at the Burton Blatt Institute

The Ad Hoc Committee on DACA and Undocumented Students continues its important work, which Provost Wheatly will report on at the next meeting.

Addressing Sexual Assault, Harassment and Relationship Violence

Four areas the University Senate and its standing committees are currently working on or may look at in the near future:

- Relationships between faculty and undergraduate students, and between faculty and graduate students
- o Mandatory training for faculty and staff regarding sexual harassment
- o Background checks for all new hires (staff and faculty)
- o Expedite the processing of sexual assault and harassment complaints

The Chancellor suggested that the Senate devote much of its last meeting in April to discussing these issues and particularly any reports and findings from the AFTPE committee.

The Chair introduced Professor Thomas Keck, chair of the Academic Freedom, Tenure, and Professional Ethics (AFTPE) Committee, to deliver the committee's report to the Senate. Professor Keck gave an overview of the existing policies regarding faculty and students.

The Chair then introduced Senator Kira Reed to present the report for the Senate Committee on Curricula. Senator Reed noted that an amended report was distributed prior to the meeting. Senator Reed asked for any questions or edits. As there were none, she made a motion to approve the report. The vote was taken and the motion passed. The report was approved.

The Chair introduced Senator Sinead Mac Namara to present the Committee on Budget and Fiscal Affairs report that was distributed to the Senate membership prior to the meeting. Discussion followed regarding spending and resources of various areas, such as the Department of Public Safety and the Slutzker Center.

The Chair announced that the Agenda Committee had two student senator nominees for a seat on the Agenda Committee. The nominees, Khem Raj Sedhai and Ginger Star Peterman, were presented to the Senate membership. The nominees' biographical information was distributed to the Senate prior to the meeting. Discussion followed regarding the Agenda Committee, meeting times, and voting procedures. The vote was held for the open seat on the Agenda Committee. Ginger Star Peterman was elected by majority to the committee.

The Chair then introduced Michael Morrison from Information Technology Services (ITS) to give a demonstration of the Ally system. Discussion followed regarding system uses and capabilities.

The Chair then announced that the Committee on Honorary Degrees would be presenting the committee's nominees for honorary degrees. The Chair asked all non-senators to kindly depart the auditorium. The Chair introduced Senator Chris Day to announce the committee's nominees. The biographical information of the nominees was sent confidentially to senators prior to the meeting and will not be reproduced for the minutes.

The first nominee was offered. Discussion followed among the Senate membership. A vote was held on the first nominee. The nominee was approved by the Senate membership.

At the conclusion of the voting, the Senate meeting reconvened and the Chair asked if there was any old business, as there was none, the Chair asked if there was any new business. As there was none, the Chair motioned to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded and the meeting adjourned.
